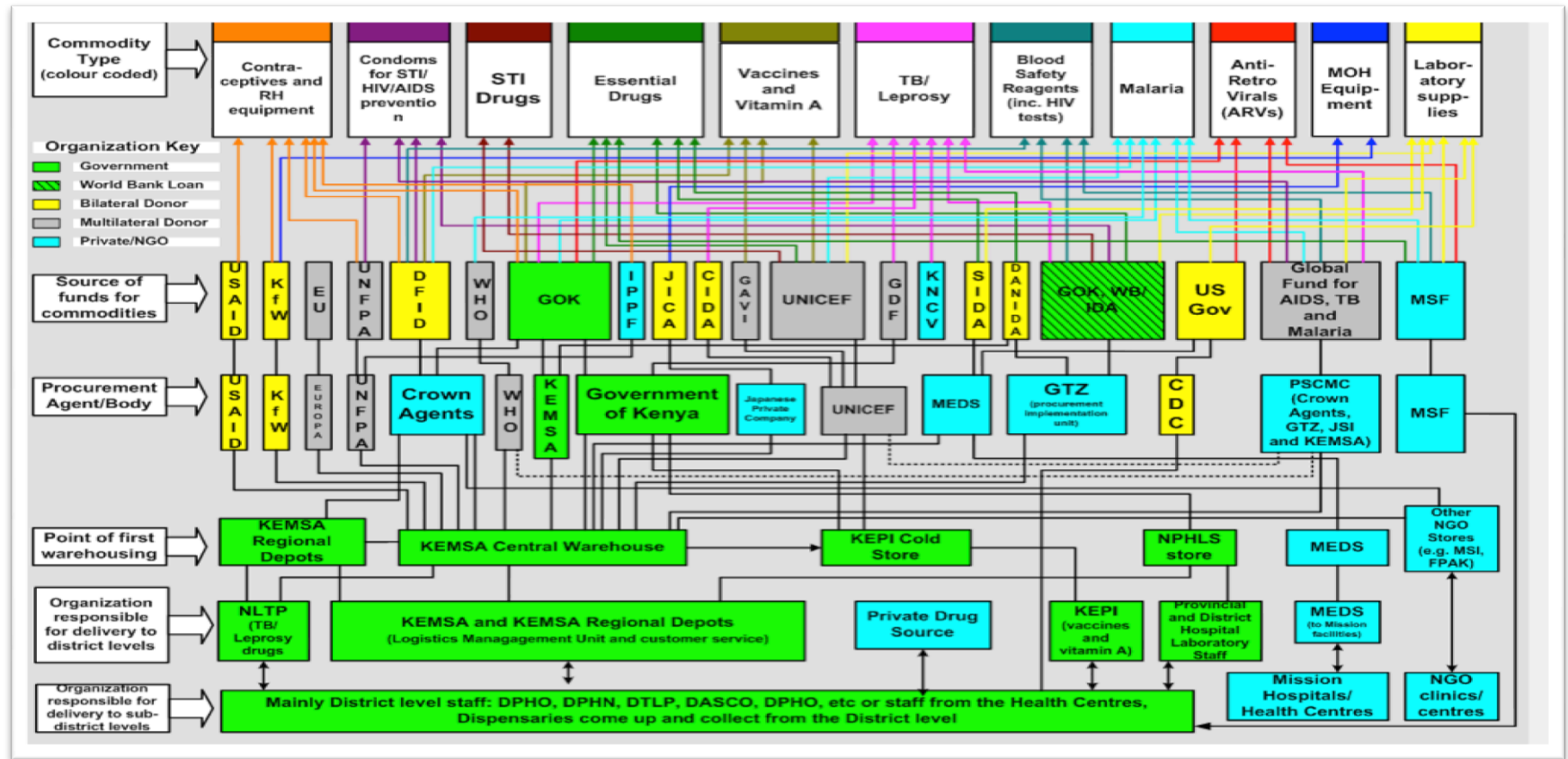

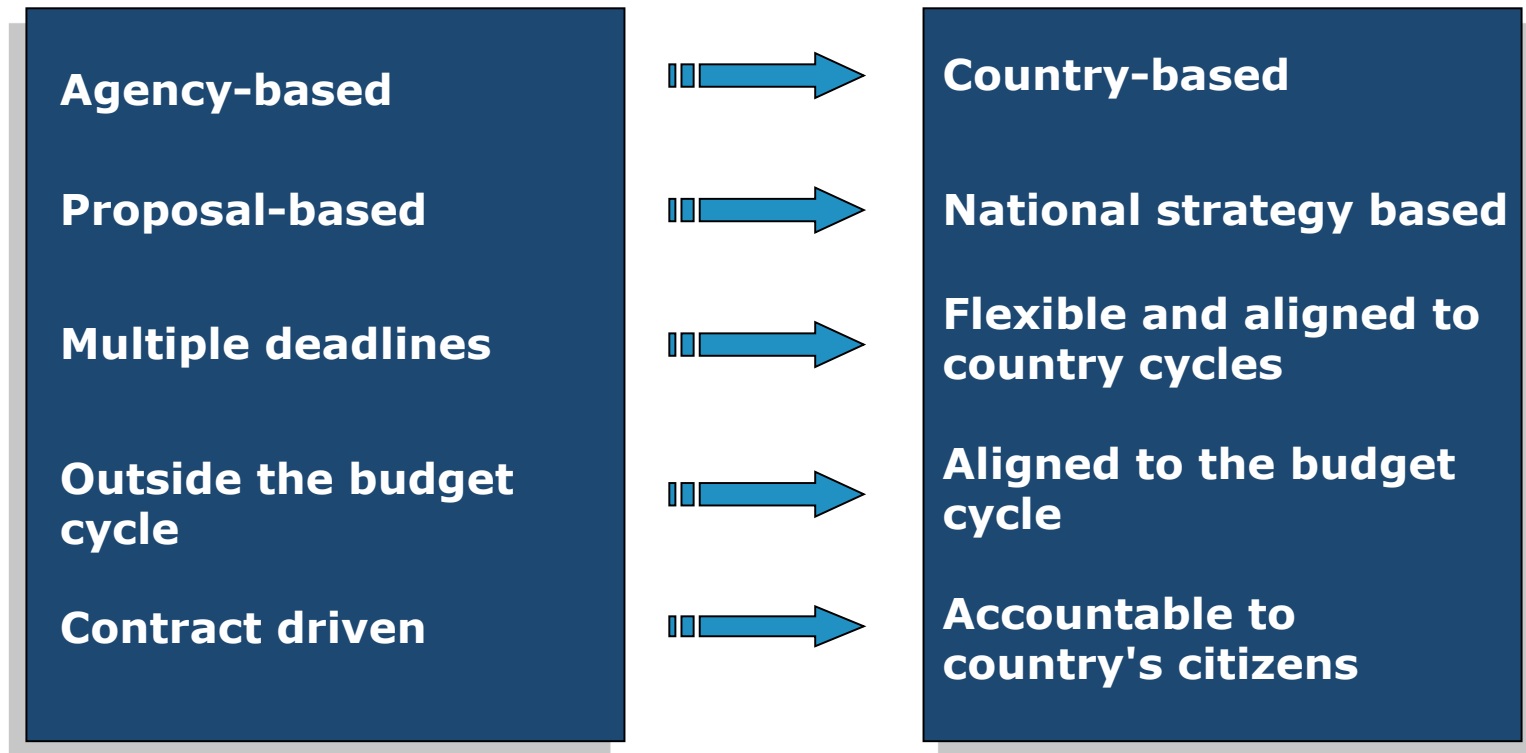
- A mechanism for mobilizing and making **better use of new and existing funds** for health – more health for money
- Consistent with principles of greater aid effectiveness agreed in Paris and Accra and IHP+
- 4 pillars: One plan, one assessment, one fiduciary framework, one results framework
- Country-driven and results-focused
- It does not require the pooling of funds
- Open to all

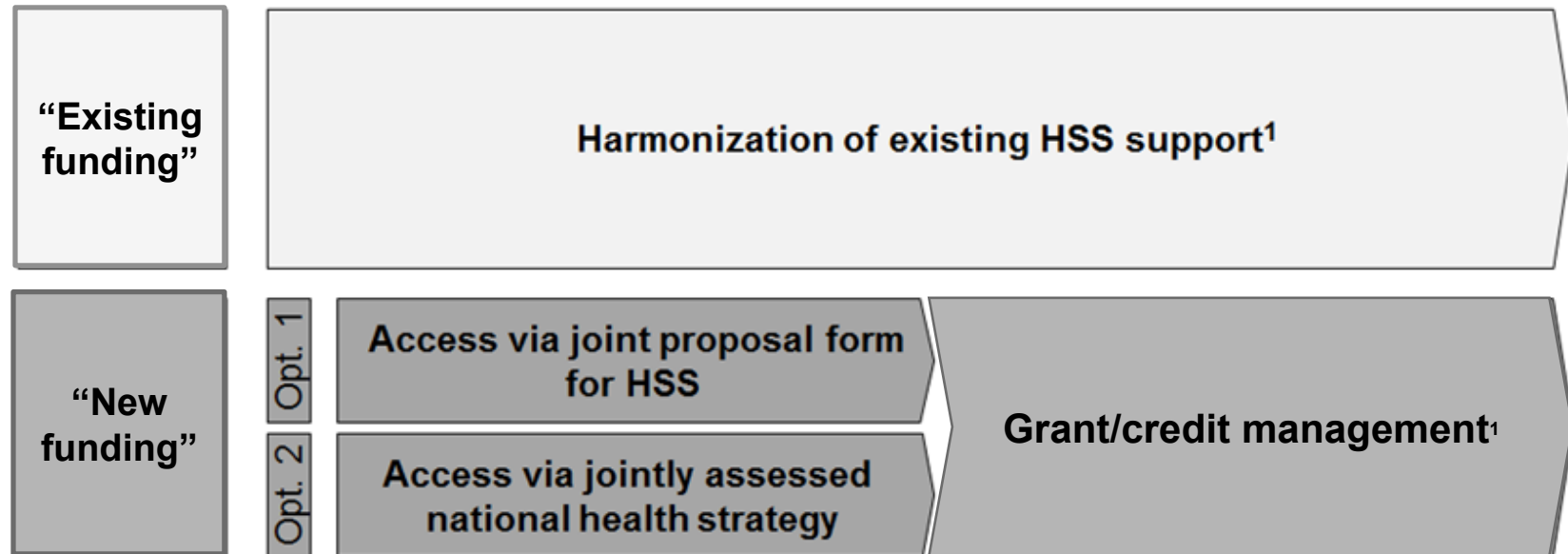

Two mechanisms for efficient funding



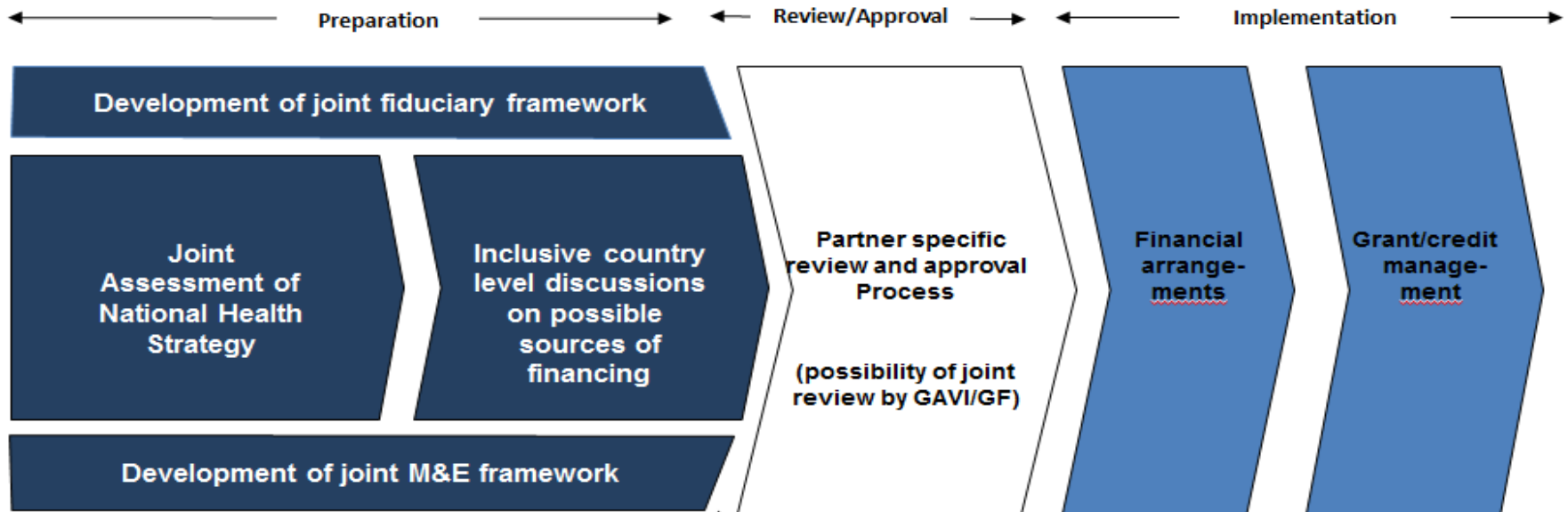
1: Separate grants with harmonized monitoring & evaluation, procurement and fiduciary frameworks

Using the Health Systems Funding Platform




Deliverable June 2011:

- 4 countries ready to (or have already) proceed(ed) to Review/Approval
- In addition 4 countries where joint fiduciary or joint M&E framework has been implemented in existing grants

 Joint process between all Platform partners

 Coordinated and possible joint elements between GAVI/GF

 Based on joint mechanism/framework



Country progress

Harmonisation of existing funding:

- Cambodia, DR Congo, Benin
- Working on a transition plan for all countries with existing HSS support to Platform principles based on agreed criteria

New funding and use of joint assessment of national strategies (JANS) :

- Nepal – JANS conducted and Joint Financing Agreement signed in August 2010 by six donors
- Ethiopia – JANS conducted, likely to firm up support by February 2011 (GAVI)
- Additional JANS conducted in Uganda, Ghana, Vietnam and planned for Rwanda, Mali

Simplified application process by GAVI and Global Fund:

- Joint application form for HSS support
- Funding based on National Health Plans

- Regular CSO conference calls (3rd call on 30 November)
- Country and CSO consultations on joint proposal form (Jan 11)

 - London Taskforce Forum
