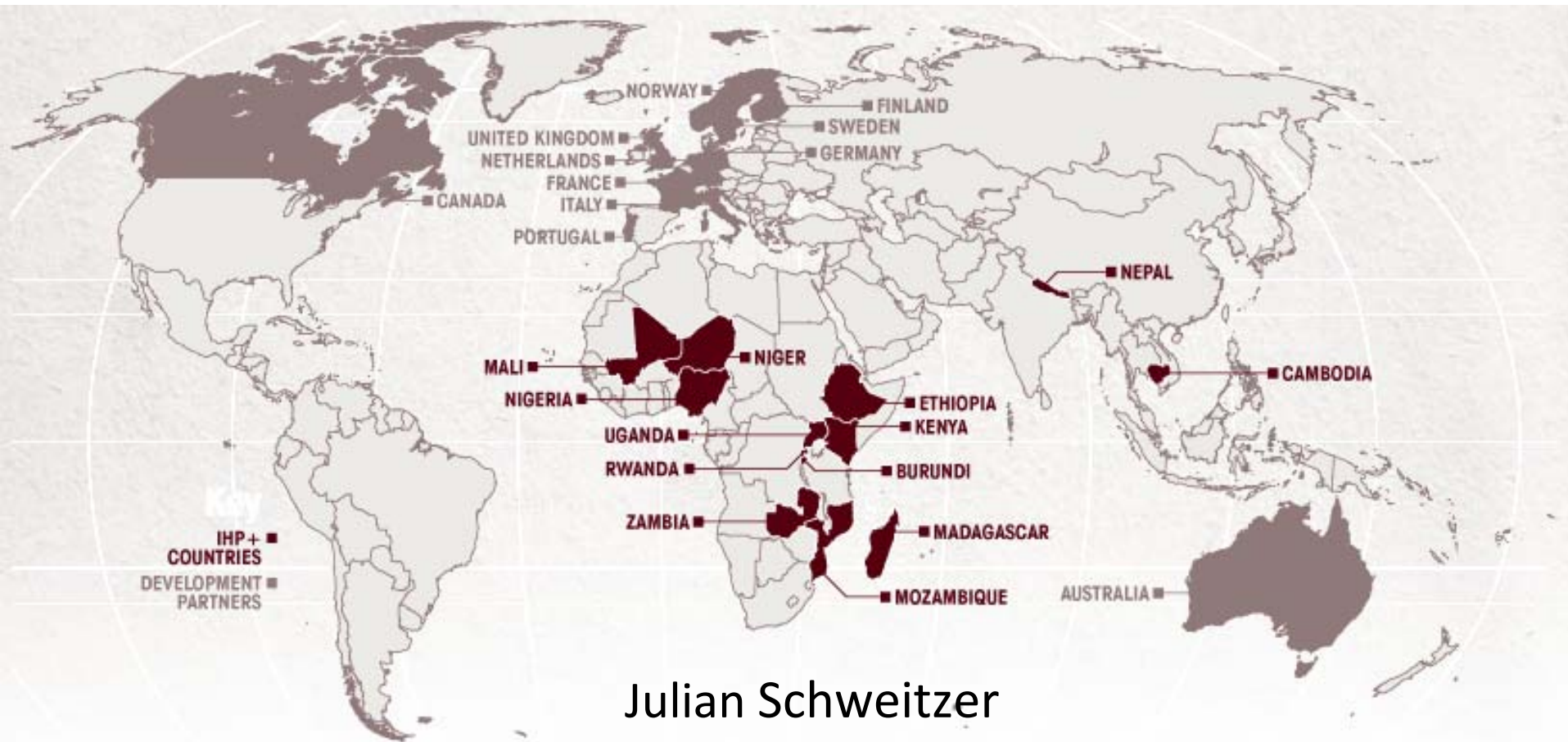


Delivering Results: Challenges for the IHP+ and How Will We Overcome Them?

More Money for Health; More Health for the Money: High-level Taskforce on Innovative International Financing for Health Systems

- Taskforce released its report and recommendations in May 2009 (<http://www.internationalhealthpartnership.net/taskforce.html>)
 - Targets up to US\$10B per year to 2015 to fill financing gap to reach health MDGs (includes existing commitments)
 - Recommends range of innovative financing options that countries and stakeholders can choose from
 - Recommends mobilizing funds (more money for health) and making better use of existing funds (more health for the money)
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Stronger Health Systems for Improved Health Service Delivery

- Strong management and **sustainable financing for health systems** are together vital to achieve results.
- Strong health systems will help ensure **equitable access of effective health interventions** and a continuum of care.
- Progress towards the health and nutrition MDGs, has been uneven.
 - Maternal and reproductive health and child under-nutrition–tracer indicators of well functioning health systems- are lagging outcomes



Collaborative Division of Labor According to Our Strengths

- MDG goals 1b, 4, 5 and 6 can still be achieved if countries and development partners streamline implementation.
- The focus should be on **national and local action** – communities and citizens, including civil society, are essential to delivering improved results for health.
- Global partners, especially GFATM, GAVI, WHO, and the World Bank have accepted the challenge from the HLTF to **strengthen their partnership on HSS**.
- Need to engage more partners.
